

Gentlemen:

Your letter of September 9 concerning the status of certain lamis in sec. 34, 7. 37 N., R. 1 E., Michigan Heridian, Michigan has just come to my attention.

June 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 of sec. 34, as shown by plat approved June 6, 1922, were included in an approved swamp land selection by the State and were patented on October 3, 1923. Father issued for Int's 1, 2, 3 and 4 and the MSSW were based either on plats approved March 5, 1843, or December 30, 1854, as indicated on the 1922 plat referred to, the year appearing with the let number on this plat. Title to lot 5 is based upon plat approved May 28, 1904.

In the case of the <u>Devey Lumber Company</u> v. St. <u>Francis Lavee</u> <u>District</u> (323 U.S. 186), the <u>United States Supreme Court said:</u>

"Mears public lands are patented according to the official pale of the survey returned to the General Land office by the Surveyor General, the notes in the surveyor General, the notes in the part of the particular appearance of the particular appearance when the part of the sector and are as much to be considered in determining what it is intended to include as if they were set forth in it. The specification in a patent of the acreage of the land conveyed is an element of the description; and, while of less influence than other elements, is yet an aid in ascertaining what land was intended."

It appears, therefore, that since patent for lot 3 is based on the 1841 plat there is ..o conflict as between the patents issued for lots 3 and 6 of this section.

The present owner of Government Lot 2, and ading to reporte submitted to this office by our field man, is subdividing the lot according to the survey approved December 30, 185% which includes lot 6 (SW EM) instead of the 7.00 acres included in the percellying east of the fictitious meandor line of the 1800 survey.

In this connection will you also advise this office as to which of the other lots resulting from the survey of 1922 remain unpaiented? Some of these descriptions are under a proposed exchange with this department and there is serious doubt in our minds as to the present observable of the new lots created by the survey of 1922.
