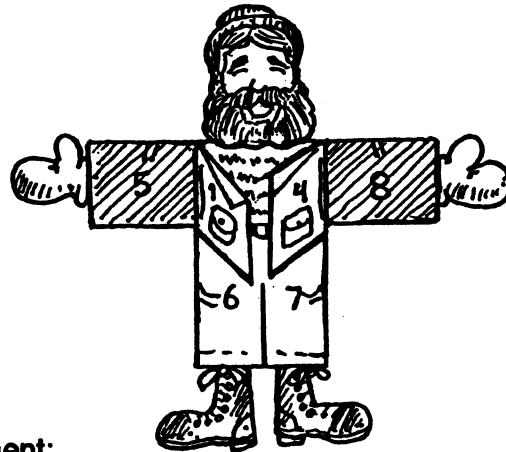
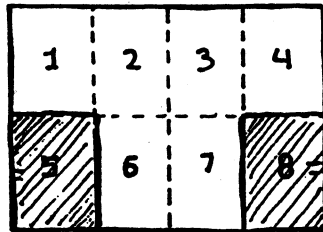




FOLD-AND-CUT

LUMBERJACK

1. Fold a 12"x18" piece of construction paper into eighths.
2. Cut out sections 5 and 8 and save for the arms.
3. Fold sections 1 and 4 toward the center to make the shirt front. Fold the top corners back to make a collar.
4. Glue sections 5 and 8 onto the back of the shirt for arms.
5. Draw, color and cut out a head for the lumberjack. Glue it on.
6. Cut a three inch slit between sections 6 and 7 to make pants.
7. Color the shirt and pants. Make hands, boots and a cap from other paper to glue onto the lumberjack.
8. Open the shirt front and glue writing paper inside the shirt.



Suggestions for use as a writing assignment:

- Retell the story of the lumbering industry.
- Retell the story of Paul Bunyan, or another Tall Tale told by the lumbermen.
- List lumberjack vocabulary and the meanings of their words.
- Tell about the Lumberman's Memorial on the Au Sable River.
- Explain how logging has changed since the mid 1800's.
- Beginning with a tree, tell the story of a board.
- Draw and label the different tools used by the lumberjacks.
- Choose one job that was done by a lumberjack. Tell what skills were needed for that job. Then tell why it would or would not have been a good job for you.

*Note : This fold and cut lumberjack can be adapted to make animals, Buck Wilder and other characters.
