### **Species Description**

Rainbow trout are the predominant species and size range depends on the time of year. Sub-legal fish are abundant soon after stocking in the spring. By late summer, fish stocked in that year are around 11-13 inches. Some fish survive multiple years, and trout up to 29 inches have been captured during DNR Fisheries surveys.

#### **Noteworthy**

There is a gravel parking lot and gravel boat launch. There is a rustic toilet at the access site. The site is closed from 11 pm to 4 am. High speed boating is prohibited on Harwood Lake from 7:30 pm to 11:00 am.

## **Fishing Regulations**

Harwood Lake is a designated Type C trout lake. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Lake Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide. There is no natural reproduction, so the rainbow trout population is sustained solely by annual stocking. Harwood Lake also provides good fishing for bluegills and yellow perch. Follow statewide regulations for all other species of fish.

#### **Directions to Site**

There is a boat launch and parking (15 spaces) at Harwood Lake's DNR access site on the west side of Corey Lake Road (also known as County Line Road). The site is about 0.2 miles north of Born Street.
