Lake Michigan spawning runs of steelhead and Chinook salmon. Stocked brown and rainbow trout.

Noteworthy

Steelhead fishing occurs from late October through June and Chinook salmon during September and October. Brown trout and rainbow trout fishing occurs all year. Fishing is best by small boat and wading from the shoreline. Bait, lodging and food is available in nearby Muskegon, Fremont and Newaygo.

Fishing Regulations

The Muskegon River at the Thornapple Street DNR Boat Access is designated a Type 4 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

From the intersection of M-37 and M-82 (Croton Drive) on the south side of Newaygo, proceed on M-82 travel east 4.5 miles to the intersection of Thornapple Street. Then turn left (north) and travel 0.9 miles to Timberview Drive, then turn left and travel 0.5 miles to the access site.
