Species Description

Brown trout are the primary species encountered at this location. These fish will be mostly 6-11 inches in length with some fish 12-16 inches occasionally found in this stretch of the river.

Noteworthy

This area is mostly swift-flowing, rocky and shallow. Channel width and depth average about 45 ft and 1.5 ft, respectively. Pools more than 4 feet deep are scarce. Substrate consists mostly of bedrock, angular cobbles and small boulders, however, gravel suitable for spawning by large salmonids occurs in scattered areas upstream from the CR-442 bridge.

Fishing Regulations

The fishing regulations split into two types at this bridge crossing the Sturgeon River. Upstream of the CR-442 bridge is designated as a Type 1 trout stream. Downstream of CR-442bridge is designated as a Type 4 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

From the intersection of Forest Highway 13 and County Road 442 travel west on CR-442 for approximately 5.0 miles to a bridge over the Sturgeon River.
