Species Description

Yearling brown trout are stocked annually at the Upper Falls. These fish will move their way down to the cascading stair-steps just above the Lower Falls where more groundwater is present with faster moving water. Few anglers target this stretch of water but reported fish are 12 to 15 inches in size.

Noteworthy

This stretch of river offers opportunities to a variety of anglers. Fly anglers get that "big water" feel on this stretch of river. Spin casters using artificial lures or natural bait can fish floating, wading or from the bank. The best access is coming in from the Lower Falls parking lot along the viewing boardwalk.

Fishing Regulations

This section of the Tahquamenon River is not classified. Please refer to the current Michigan Fishing Guide for regulations.

Directions to Site

From Newberry, drive north on M-123 towards Paradise for about 26 miles to the Lower Falls Overlook entrance at Tahquamenon Falls State Park. Use the viewing platform boardwalk to access the section of river just above the Lower Falls. There is a hiking trail that runs parallel to the river from the Lower to the Upper Falls. The State Park entrance is 10 miles from Paradise.
