B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

D-3; One-quarter Corner common to Sections 5 and 8, T51N, R33W;

Recovered the BLM monument and all accessories as described in Part A. I did not find
Mr. Hall's cedar post. From this monument the centerline tangents of Bear Town Road
extend to the east and to the south. I left the BLM monument in place and stamped the
cap "PA 345 1996". Accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the
original corner.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

D-3; One-quarter Corner common to Sections 5 and 8, T51N, R33W;

Originally established during U.S. Survey conducted by Harvey Mellen, D.S. in 1845 and monumented with a hemlock post witnessed by a

Yellow Birch 12 N41°W 19 lks. and a Yellow Birch 10 N52°E 06 lks.

During the course of a survey conducted by Stephen Douglas of the Bureau of Land Management from 10 May 1984 to 10 November 1984 and approved 23 September 1985, a 6 inch diameter cedar post projecting 5½ feet above ground with the southeast face scribed as to location as set in 1935 by Marshall J. Hall, Junior Engineer, U.S. Indian Service was found and accepted. The BLM recovered Mr. Hall's field notes of the "Carp River Truck Trail" survey at the Federal Records Center, Chicago, Illinois. The BLM remonumented the corner with a 2½" x 30" aluminum pipe and cap stamped as to location and noted the following new bearing trees:

Maple 7 S84°E 13½ lks. (8.91')

Found sugar maple presently alive and 9" in dia. having a partially healed lower blaze with some scribing visible.

Set 7" spike N/side Measured S88°E 8.91'

Maple 6 N34°W 30 lks. (19.80')

Found red maple presently alive and 9" in dia. having an open lower blaze with scribing visible.

Set 7" spike W/side Measured N40°W 19.80'

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position:

D-3; One-quarter Corner common to Sections 5 and 8, T51N, R33W;

Found 2½" dia. aluminum pipe with 3" aluminum cap appropriately stamped as to location as set by the BLM in 1984.

Set 7" spike NW/side 11" Red Maple N53°E 31.38'

Set 7" spike NW/side 9" Sugar Maple S43°W 38.34'

Location Post S20°E 1.0'

All of the above new bearing trees are marked with upper and lower blazes, scribed "NBT", and painted red.

The following new bearing trees were established by the BLM in 1984. The condition of each is described in Part A.

Set 7" spike N/side 9" Sugar Maple S88°E 8.91'

Set 7" spike W/side 9" Red Maple N40°W 19.80'

The above BLM new bearing trees were painted red.

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
