B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

No original evidence was found. Area was extensively logged and burned over in about 1900. Entire area was owned by Kimberly Clark in the past and they logged it off about 1960. No current evidence of the corner was found. Corner was re-established by single proportionate measurement between opposite section corners.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

At the corner position I set a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ "x30" split base aluminum monument with a 3" cap stamped to read: County Remonumentation, T48N R41W, S10, S15, $\frac{1}{4}$, 1997, P.S. 17610. I established three bearing trees and a reference object.
