#### 1 - Sale Area

#### 1.2 - Boundaries

#### 1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (1/14)

The sale boundary and Payment Unit boundaries are marked and identified by blue, red and yellow paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against private property are marked with blue paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against state land are marked with red paint. Interior Payment Unit boundaries are marked with yellow paint. The painted boundary line trees are not Included Timber and are to be protected unless marked with orange paint.

# 2 - Timber Specifications

#### 2.1 - Included Timber

#### 2.1.2 - Clearcut unit(s) w/o unmerchantable trees (8/11)

Within Payment Unit(s) 7, cut all trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization, unless marked with green paint. In addition, unmerchantable trees may be cut as necessary to facilitate harvest of designated timber, but must be severed at ground level and laid flat on the ground; not just broken, bent, or pushed over.

## 2.1.3 - Cut tree marked unit(s) (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 2 - 6, all trees are designated for cutting when marked with orange paint above and below stump height, regardless of merchantability. In addition, within Payment Units 3 and 4, cut all beech and aspen trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization, unless marked with green paint. Within Payment Units 5 and 6, cut all ironwood greater than 4 inches at DBH. Also, unmerchantable trees may be cut as necessary to facilitate harvest of designated timber, but must be severed at ground level and laid flat on the ground; not just broken, bent, or pushed over.

#### 2.1.5 - Overstory removal unit(s) (8/11)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1 and 8, all deciduous trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization, are designated for cutting, except for elm, juneberry, or any trees marked with green paint. In addition, cut all jack pine and scotch pine greater than 1 inch at DBH. Also, unmerchantable trees may be cut as necessary to facilitate harvest of designated timber, but must be severed at ground level and laid flat on the ground; not just broken, bent, or pushed over.

#### 2.2 - Utilization

## 2.2.4 - Skidding length (2/14)

Skidding of unlimbed tops or lengths over 17 feet is not permissible within Payment Units 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 unless approved by the Unit Manager or his/her representative.

#### 3 - Payments

# 3.4 - Damaged Timber

#### 3.4.1 - Damaged timber (6/14)

General Condition and Requirement 3.4 Damaged Timber, defines liquidated damages for undesignated live merchantable trees which are cut or injured. In addition, extreme care should be taken to avoid damage to tree seedlings and saplings within Payment Units 1, 2, 7 and 8. Within these units, if more than 50 percent of the tree seedlings or saplings (1/4" to 4.5" DBH) within a specified portion of the sale area are damaged, liquidated damages will be assessed at \$150 per acre for all acreage within that specified portion of the sale area that was damaged.

No damage is acceptable to merchantable trees. Within the sale area, if more than 10 percent of trees (> 4.5" DBH) within a specified area of the sale are damaged, liquidated damages will be assessed for all trees damaged. Rates will be in accordance with General Condition and Requirement 3.4 Damaged Timber.

#### 4 - Transportation

#### 4.1 - Construction

#### 4.1.3 - Slash and earthen piles (8/04)

Piles or windrows of earth along roads and landings that have been widened or constructed shall be leveled. Slash from road maintenance or construction, including stumps, shall be dispersed throughout the sale.

#### 4.1.7 - Road closure (10/11)

All new roads built into the sale must be blocked to vehicle traffic upon completion of the sale. Overgrown roads that are reopened shall be considered new roads. In general, this will require constructing a four (4') foot high berm of stumps and logs covered with earth. Contact the sale administrator for specific details of design and placement.

## 5 - Operations

#### 5.2 - Conduct of Operations

#### 5.2.1 - Slash

#### 5.2.1.8 - Slash height (12/08)

No slash or tree tops may exceed 36 inches in height. Exception: within Payment Units 1 and 8, slash must be chipped and removed from the site, or placed in scattered, compacted piles not exceeding 5 feet in height.

#### 5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions

#### 5.2.3.3 - Bark slippage restriction (3/09)

Within Payment Unit(s) 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, unless changed by written agreement, cutting, forwarding and skidding are not permitted during the period of April 15 to July 15. This restriction is because of bark slippage.

#### 5.2.4 - Dead and Down Creation

## 5.2.4.1 - Dead and down creation, marked trees (10/13)

All trees marked with an orange "X" must be felled and left on site for wildlife.

#### 5.2.18 - Equipment requirements (1/09)

Because dense saplings surround much of the designated timber in Payment Units 1, 2, 7, and 8, it is highly recommended, but not required, that a feller-buncher be used to approach, cut and pile the trees for subsequent in-woods processing and forwarding.

#### 5.2.29 - Shrub protection (9/07)

Do not cut or damage hawthorn or juneberry. These woody-shrub plants are highly beneficial to various wildlife species.

# 5.2.38 - No decking against live trees (2/04)

Cut products may not be decked against unmarked or designated leave trees.

## 5.2.40 - Pathway protection (10/10)

The Shore to Shore riding/hiking trail runs on Hooker Road along the north side of Payment Unit 1, as shown on the Timber Sale Map. Do not cut trees or damage posts with blue pathway markers. Maintain a 20-foot wide slash, debris, and rut free zone daily, using the pathway as the centerline. No decking will be allowed along the trail. The trail must be graded periodically during the sale. In addition, if an organized trail ride is to occur while the sale is active, the sale administrator has the authority to limit harvest and hauling activities on the day of the ride. The sale administrator will provide at least 1 week notice if this is to occur.

#### 5.2.41 - Snowmobile trail protection (9/11)

The Platte River snowmobile trail runs along N. Haze Road west of the sale and along Oakley Road southeast of Payment Unit 5, as shown on the Timber Sale Map. Do not cut or damage posts with orange trail markers or traffic control signs. If the trail is used for hauling, it must be graded to the satisfaction of the Unit Manager or his/her representative prior to December 1st. If the trail road is to be used for hauling during the snowmobile season, then a snow covered base must be left on the trail. Maintain a 20 foot wide slash, debris, and rut free zone daily using the snowmobile trail as the centerline. No decking of forest products will be permitted along the snowmobile trail between December 1 and March 31. All stumps within 20 feet of the snowmobile trail must be cut at ground level. In addition, any trees cut within 5 feet of the trail must have the stumps removed and be disposed of according to the direction of the Unit Manager or his/her representative.

#### 5.4 - Soil Protection

## 5.4.3 - Erosion control (12/08)

Skid trails or haul roads may require erosion control structures or berms per direction of the Unit Manager or his/her representative.

# 6 - Safety and Fire Prevention

# 6.2 - Signing

## 6.2.1 - Road posting (9/09)

The Purchaser is responsible for posting and maintaining caution signs on N. Haze, Hooker, Steam Hauler, and Oakley roads prior to beginning operations. The road must be posted at appropriate distances from the sale area to warn of logging activity and truck traffic. Signs must be removed when harvest operations are suspended or completed. The Purchaser will provide these signs.
