- 1. <u>Bid Location, Date, and Time:</u> Bids must be received by the Unit Manager, Newberry Management Unit, Box 428, Newberry, MI 49868, no later than 3:00 p.m. on May 7, 2009. For further information concerning this sale, contact the Unit Manager at 906-293-3293.
- 2. <u>Bidder's Qualifications</u>: Purchaser shall obtain workers compensation insurance to cover claims under Michigan's Worker's Disability Compensation Act of 1969 or similar employee benefit act of any other state applicable to an employee. If all or part of a timber sale was prepared by a private contractor, that contractor and that contractor's company are <u>not permitted</u> to bid on the timber sale contract. Bids will not be accepted from individuals or companies appearing on the DNR/FMFM No-Bid List. This list contains the names of purchasers who previously failed to execute a contract within 21-days or who have a history of poor performance.
- 3. <u>Preparation of Sealed Bids:</u> Bids shall be manually signed in ink; bid prices must be entered for each species and product in the Bid Price column for all material subject to bidding; and all fill-in blanks must be completed. If erasures or other changes appear on the forms, each erasure or change must be initialed by the person signing the bid.
- 4. <u>Submission of Sealed Bids</u>: Bid forms may be obtained from the Unit Manager. All bids must be submitted on the bid form and in an <u>envelope clearly identified</u> as described in this section. NOTE: Only one bid form per bid envelope. Sealed bids must be submitted to the Unit office designated in the prospectus and must be submitted at or prior to the time established in the prospectus. The envelope should show on the outside (a) that it is a "Bid for Timber," and (b) the sale name or number, and (c) the date and time of bid opening as shown in the prospectus. Bids received after the time specified in the sale prospectus are late bids and will be rejected.
- 5. Public Opening of Sealed Bids: If conditions permit, the sealed bids will be publicly opened and posted at the time and place set in the prospectus.
- 6. Award of Contract: Award of the contract will be made to the Bidder whose bid, conforming to the prospectus, is most advantageous to the State of Michigan on the basis of total value at rates bid for the estimated quantities. The State reserves the right to reject any bid or waive any minor irregularity in bids received. A written award mailed (or otherwise furnished) to the successful Bidder shall be deemed to result in a binding contract without further action by either party.
- 7. <u>Down Payment:</u> The Bidder to whom award is made must make a down payment within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the down payment will be calculated as shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. Only cash may be used to meet this requirement.
- 8. Performance Security: As guarantee of faithful performance, a cash bond, certificate of deposit, surety bond or irrevocable letter of credit (LOC) is required within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the performance security is shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. If an LOC or surety is used, the coverage must extend for at least 6 months beyond the contract expiration.
- 9. <u>Timber Sale Contract</u>: Additional conditions and requirements common to all timber sales are listed on the timber sale contract (R4031) and are available on line at www.michigan.gov/dnr. Contact the Unit Manager for additional information or a sample contract. Within 21 days of the date of the award letter, the bidder must sign the contract and provide the required down payment, performance security, and verification of worker's disability compensation. The down payment and performance security shall be in accordance with the provisions of the timber sale contract, in the sums stated in this prospectus. If these actions are not taken, then the Bidder, the Bidder's corporation, and the corporation's principals may not be permitted to bid on State timber sales for a period of 1 year. In addition, the Bidder certifies that if awarded this contract, the Bidder will complete the timber sale contract in accordance with its terms and any modifications thereof including requirements to purchase, cut, and remove the included timber by the termination date.

10. Disclaimer of Estimates and Bidder's Warranty of Inspection: Before submitting this bid, the Bidder is advised and cautioned to inspect the sale area, review the requirements of the sale contract, and take other steps as may be reasonably necessary to ascertain the location, estimated volumes, construction estimates, and operating costs of the proposed sale. Failure to do so will not relieve the Bidder from responsibility for completing the contract.

The Bidder warrants that this bid is submitted solely on the basis of the Bidder's examination and inspection of the quality and quantity of the timber offered for sale and the Bidder's opinion of the value thereof and the costs of recovery. No reliance should be placed on the State of Michigan's estimates of timber quality, quantity or costs of recovery. Bidder further acknowledges that the State of Michigan: (i) expressly disclaims any warranty of fitness of timber for any purpose; (ii) offers this timber as is without any warranty of quality (merchantability) or quantity and (iii) expressly disclaims any warranty as to the quantity or quality of timber sold.

11. Certification and Chain-of-Custody: Unless otherwise indicated in the contract under section 7 - Other Conditions of the Sale Specific Conditions & Requirements, the area encompassed by this timber sale is certified to the standards of the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) - Certificate #SCS-FM/COC-090N and the Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) - Certificate # NSF-SFIS-5Y031-S1. Forest products from this sale may be delivered to the mill as "FSC and / or SFI certified" as long as the contractor hauling the forest products is chain-of-custody (COC) certified or covered under a COC certificate from the destination mill. The purchaser is responsible for maintaining COC after leaving the sale area.



1 - Sale Area

1.2 - Boundaries

1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (6/05)

The sale boundary is marked and identified by red paint. Interior Payment Unit boundaries are marked with green paint (double lines). Green painted trees within both units are designated reserve trees, and are NOT to be cut.

2 - Timber Specifications

2.1 - Included Timber

2.1.2 - Clearcut unit(s) w/o unmerchantable trees (5/07)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1 and 2, cut all aspen, paper birch, red maple, sugar maple, balsam fir, and black spruce trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization. DO NOT CUT ANY WHITE PINE, RED PINE, CEDAR, HEMLOCK, YELLOW BIRCH, WHITE SPRUCE or reserve trees marked with GREEN PAINT. Reserve trees identified in accordance with 2.1.12 - Reserve trees, within clearcutting unit boundaries, are not Included Timber and are to be protected.

2.1.11 - Description of timber note (2/04)

Note that MIXED HARDWOOD includes red maple, sugar maple, and a small amount of paper birch.

2.1.12 - Reserve trees (2/04)

The Purchaser shall not cut live or dead reserve trees within cutting units or clearings. Reserve trees are marked with green paint (includes aspen, paper birch, red and sugar maple). The Purchaser shall protect reserve trees from damage by the Purchaser's operations. If the Purchaser's operations have cut or damaged reserve trees through carelessness, the Purchaser shall pay the average district price, by species, as fixed, agreed and liquidated damages for each reserve tree cut or damaged. Such payment does not constitute ownership of the undesignated timber.

2.2 - Utilization

2.2.8 - Utilization and removal. (7/05)

All products meeting standards set forth in 2.2 Utilization must be removed from the sale area.

4 - Transportation

4.1 - Construction

4.1.4 - Timber removed for construction (2/04)

Trees cut or damaged in the process of a pre-approved road, landing or skid trail construction will be decked in an area separate from wood removed from the timber sale until such time as it is scaled and paid for.

4.1.5 - Culverts (3/08)

Roads may require the installation of culverts at cross drainages on wet soils, or across natural drainage-ways. Culverts shall be placed in locations specified by the sale administrator and shall be new, corrugated metal or plastic gauge. Culverts will be a minimum of 12 inches in diameter and 24 feet long. Culverts shall be installed prior to use of the road. If culverts are removed, fill shall be removed from wetland soils as specified. Soils shall be maintained and left in a non-erodible condition, with water bars, seed, fertilizer, mulch, and slash installed as directed by the sale administrator and as specified in the BMP manual. Stream crossing permits, if needed, will be obtained by the DNR.

4.1.6 - Road construction (6/07)

Construction of new roads or improvements of existing roads shall be done in such a way as to minimize the environmental and visual impacts. Merchantable trees shall be cut and utilized unless otherwise directed. Non-merchantable trees shall be severed and laid flat on the ground. Slash shall be reserved to obliterate new roads once operations are completed, and kept a minimum of 10 feet back from the road edge. Stumps shall be set upright, not left on edge, and be moved at least 10 feet away from the road edge. Disturbed soil shall be feathered into the woods and not left in berms or windrows.

4.1.7 - Road closure (4/07)

All new roads built into the sale must be blocked to vehicle traffic upon completion of the sale. Overgrown and/or abandoned roads that are reopened shall be considered new roads. In general, this will require placing stumps/slash/debris in the roadway for a minimum of 100 - 200 feet, effectively obliterating the road. These roads must be rendered impassable to cars, trucks, and ORV's. Stumps from road building and landing construction can be reserved to meet the above road closure specifications. Contact the sale administrator for specific details of design and placement.

4.2 - Maintenance

4.2.1 - Hauling restriction (3/07)

Hauling may be restricted on forest roads by the Unit Manager or their representative. The restriction may occur at any time that road conditions deteriorate substantially due to weather conditions.

4.2.3 - Road maintenance (9/08)

The following road maintenance may be required: daily blading/leveling and/or routine grading of the Halifx Road, if conditions warrant.

4.2.5 - Two wheel drive condition (2/04)

All existing trail roads on and adjacent to the sale area must be passable by two-wheel drive traffic for the duration of the sale.

5 - Operations

5.2 - Conduct of Operations

5.2.1 - Slash

5.2.1.2 - Slash Removal

5.2.1.2.1 - Slash removal (12/04)

All slash must be removed at least 10 feet from the cleared right-of-way of forest roads.

5.2.1.7 - Slash must be scattered (2/04)

Unless otherwise directed, slash and logging debris shall be uniformly scattered over the sale area and not left in piles or windrows. Slash shall not be allowed to accumulate at the landings. All slash work shall be done concurrently with harvesting.

5.2.1.8 - Slash height (2/04)

No slash or tree tops may exceed 24 inches in height.

5.2.2 - Snags

5.2.2.1 - Den trees (2/04)

Obvious hollow and/or den trees shall be protected and left standing unless they are a safety hazard.

5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions

5.2.3.1 - Operating restrictions (3/07)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1 and 2, unless changed by written agreement, cutting, skidding, and hauling are limited to the period of December 15th - March 1st. This restriction is due to the wet nature and/or poor drainage of the soils. A waiver may be granted for a dry summer only.

5.2.38 - No decking against live trees (2/04)

Cut products may not be decked against unmarked or designated leave trees.

5.4 - Soil Protection

5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (5/08)

Operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting of roads which is 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. In addition, operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting on skid trails which is 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. The Unit Manager or their representative may restrict hauling and/or skidding if ruts exceed the specified depth. With the Unit Manager or their representative's approval, the Purchaser may return to the area when the weather conditions have changed and/or the risk of rutting has decreased.

5.4.5 - Soil caution (11/04)

Care must be taken to minimize soil damage due to the heavy, seasonally saturated soils within the sale area.

5.4.6 - Wet area protection (9/05)

No harvesting operations, including skidding and felling, are to take place within small leatherleaf areas with sub-merchantable spruce/tamarack (primarily along the W. side of the Halifax Road). Care must be taken by the purchaser to identify and avoid operating in these areas of the timber sale.

5.8 - Protection of Habitat of Endangered Species

5.8.5 - Protection of raptor nests (9/05)

All trees with raptor nests will be protected if found during harvesting operations. Notification will be made to the Unit Manager and Wildlife Biologist so an on-site evaluation and recommendation can be made, if necessary.



1 - Sale Area

1.2 - Boundaries

1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (6/05)

The sale boundary is marked and identified by blue and red paint. Exterior sale boundaries against State land are marked with red paint. Exterior sale boundaries against private land are marked with bule paint. Interior Payment Unit boundaries are marked with green or red paint.

2 - Timber Specifications

2.1 - Included Timber

2.1.3 - Cut tree marked unit(s) (8/04)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1 - 4, all trees are designated for cutting when marked with orange paint above and below stump height, regardless of merchantability. In addition, within Payment Units 3 and 4, cut all balsam that meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization whether marked with orange paint or not. NOTE: Care must be taken to protect any hemlock regeneration within the sale area.

2.1.11 - Description of timber note (2/04)

Note that MIXED HARDWOOD PULP includes maple, cherry, and beech. MIXED HARDWOOD SAWLOGS includes red maple and sugar maple.

2.2 - Utilization

2.2.3 - Stump heights (4/07)

Stump heights within the Sale Area shall not exceed 12 inches for trees greater than 10 inches DBH and 4 inches for trees smaller than 10 inches DBH.

2.2.4 - Skidding length (2/04)

Skidding of unlimbed tops or lengths over 17 feet is not permissible unless approved by the Unit Manager or their representative.

4 - Transportation

4.1 - Construction

4.1.6 - Road construction (6/07)

Construction of new roads or improvements of existing roads shall be done in such a way as to minimize the environmental and visual impacts. Merchantable trees shall be cut and utilized unless otherwise directed. Non-merchantable trees shall be severed and laid flat on the ground. Slash shall be scattered, and not left in windrows. Stumps shall be set upright, not left on edge, and be moved at least 10 feet away from the road edge. Disturbed soil shall be feathered into the woods and not left in berms or windrows.

4.1.7 - Road closure (4/07)

All new roads built into the sale must be blocked to vehicle traffic within 30 DAYS of completion of hauling. Overgrown and/or abandoned roads that are reopened shall be considered new roads. In general, this will require placing stumps and slash in the road course for a minimum of 200 feet. These roads must be rendered impassable to cars, trucks and ORV's. Stumps from road building and landing construction can be reserved to meet the above road closure specifications. Contact the sale administrator for specific details of design and placement.

4.1.12 - No new roads (5/07)

No new roads will be permitted other than in those locations shown on the sale map unless otherwise agreed to by the Sale Administrator at the pre-sale conference. All operations are limited to existing roads.

4.2 - Maintenance

4.2.1 - Hauling restriction (3/07)

Hauling may be restricted on forest roads by the Unit Manager or their representative. The restriction may occur at any time that the weather is not conducive to hauling without excessive damage to the roads or the sale area (ex. wet weather conditions).

4.2.5 - Two wheel drive condition (2/04)

All existing trail roads on and adjacent to the sale area must be passable by two-wheel drive traffic for the duration of the sale.

5 - Operations

5.1 - Notification

5.1.1 - Pre-sale conference (2/08)

A pre-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required prior to beginning operations to determine landing and access road locations. The Unit Manager or their representative must be contacted at least 5 days in advance to schedule the conference.

5.1.4 - Post-sale conference (2/04)

A post-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required 5 days prior to the completion of active logging operations to determine clean-up and repair of landings, road edges, and the fulfillment of other contract specifications.

5.2 - Conduct of Operations

5.2.1 - Slash

5.2.1.1 - Slash within sale area (2/04)

No trees are to be felled outside the sale area and all slash is to be kept at least 10 feet back from the blue paint line.

5.2.1.7 - Slash must be scattered (2/04)

Unless otherwise directed, slash and logging debris shall be uniformly scattered over the sale area and not left in piles or windrows. Slash shall not be allowed to accumulate at the landings. All slash work shall be done concurrently with harvesting.

5.2.1.8 - Slash height (2/04)

No slash or tree tops may exceed 36 inches in height.

5.2.2 - Snags

5.2.2.1 - Den trees (2/04)

Obvious hollow and/or den trees shall be protected and left standing unless they are a safety hazard.

5.2.12 - Bark slippage restriction (3/07)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1-4, unless changed by written agreement, cutting and skidding are not permitted during the period of April 15 to July 15. This restriction is because of bark slippage.

5.2.37 - No decking areas (10/04)

No decking is allowed within 50 feet of County Roads 422 or 453 without permission of the Luce County Road Commission.

5.2.38 - No decking against live trees (2/04)

Cut products may not be decked against unmarked or designated leave trees.

5.2.39 - ORV trail protection (9/07)

The Silver Creek ORV trail and is shown on the Timber Sale Map. Do not cut trees or damage posts with orange ORV markers. Maintain a 20 foot wide slash, debris, and rut free zone daily using the ORV trail as the centerline. Do not run equipment down the ORV trail. Skidding across the trail may only occur in locations approved by the sale administrator.


