1. <u>Bid Location, Date, and Time</u>: Bids must be received by the Unit Manager, Gladwin Management Unit, 801 N. Silverleaf, Gladwin, MI 48624, no later than 2:00 p.m. on January 6, 2010. For further information concerning this sale, contact the Unit Manager at 989-426-9205

2. <u>Bidder's Qualifications</u>: Purchaser shall obtain workers compensation insurance to cover claims under Michigan's Worker's Disability Compensation Act of 1969 or similar employee benefit act of any other state applicable to an employee. If all or part of a timber sale was prepared by a private contractor, that contractor and that contractor's company are <u>not permitted</u> to bid on the timber sale contract. Bids will not be accepted from individuals or companies appearing on the DNR/FMFM No-Bid List. This list contains the names of purchasers who previously failed to execute a contract within 21-days or who have a history of poor performance.

3. <u>Preparation of Sealed Bids</u>: Bids shall be manually signed in ink; bid prices must be entered for each species and product in the Bid Price column for all material subject to bidding; and all fill-in blanks must be completed. If erasures or other changes appear on the forms, each erasure or change must be initialed by the person signing the bid.

4. <u>Submission of Sealed Bids</u>: Bid forms may be obtained from the Unit Manager. All bids must be submitted on the bid form and in an <u>envelope clearly identified</u> as described in this section. NOTE: Only one bid form per bid envelope. Sealed bids must be submitted to the Unit office designated in the prospectus and must be submitted at or prior to the time established in the prospectus. The envelope should show on the outside (a) that it is a "Bid for Timber," and (b) the sale name or number, and (c) the date and time of bid opening as shown in the prospectus. Bids received after the time specified in the sale prospectus are late bids and will be rejected.

5. <u>Public Opening of Sealed Bids</u>: If conditions permit, the sealed bids will be publicly opened and posted at the time and place set in the prospectus.

6. <u>Award of Contract</u>: Award of the contract will be made to the Bidder whose bid, conforming to the prospectus, is most advantageous to the State of Michigan on the basis of total value at rates bid for the estimated quantities. The State reserves the right to reject any bid or waive any minor irregularity in bids received. A written award mailed (or otherwise furnished) to the successful Bidder shall be deemed to result in a binding contract without further action by either party.

7. <u>Down Payment</u>: The Bidder to whom award is made must make a down payment within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the down payment will be calculated as shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. Only cash may be used to meet this requirement.

8. <u>Performance Security</u>: As guarantee of faithful performance, a cash bond, certificate of deposit, surety bond or irrevocable letter of credit (LOC) is required within 21 days of the sale award. The amount of the performance security is shown in the Bond and Payment Schedule of this prospectus. If an LOC or surety is used, the coverage must extend for at least 6 months beyond the contract expiration.

9. <u>Timber Sale Contract</u>: Additional conditions and requirements common to all timber sales are listed on the timber sale contract (R4031) and are available on line at <u>www.michigan.gov/dnr</u>. Contact the Unit Manager for additional information or a sample contract. Within 21 days of the date of the award letter, the bidder must sign the contract and provide the required down payment, performance security, and verification of worker's disability compensation. The down payment and performance security shall be in accordance with the provisions of the timber sale contract, in the sums stated in this prospectus. If these actions are not taken, then the Bidder, the Bidder's corporation, and the corporation's principals may not be permitted to bid on State timber sales for a period of 1 year. In addition, the Bidder certifies that if awarded this contract, the Bidder will complete the timber sale contract in accordance with its terms and any modifications thereof including requirements to purchase, cut, and remove the included timber by the termination date.

10. <u>Disclaimer of Estimates and Bidder's Warranty of Inspection</u>: Before submitting this bid, the Bidder is advised and cautioned to inspect the sale area, review the requirements of the sale contract, and take other steps as may be reasonably necessary to ascertain the location, estimated volumes, construction estimates, and operating costs of the proposed sale. Failure to do so will not relieve the Bidder from responsibility for completing the contract.

The Bidder warrants that this bid is submitted solely on the basis of the Bidder's examination and inspection of the quality and quantity of the timber offered for sale and the Bidder's opinion of the value thereof and the costs of recovery. No reliance should be placed on the State of Michigan's estimates of timber quality, quantity or costs of recovery. Bidder further acknowledges that the State of Michigan: (i) expressly disclaims any warranty of fitness of timber for any purpose; (ii) offers this timber as is without any warranty of quality (merchantability) or quantity and (iii) expressly disclaims any warranty as to the quantity or quality of timber sold.

11. Certification and Chain-of-Custody: Unless otherwise indicated in the contract under section 7 - Other Conditions of the Sale Specific Conditions & Requirements, the area encompassed by this timber sale is certified to the standards of the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) - Certificate #SCS-FM/COC-090N and the Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) - Certificate # NSF-SFIS-5Y031-S1. Forest products from this sale may be delivered to the mill as "FSC and / or SFI certified" as long as the contractor hauling the forest products is chain-of-custody (COC) certified or covered under a COC certificate from the destination mill. The purchaser is responsible for maintaining COC after leaving the sale area.

1 - Sale Area

1.2 - Boundaries

1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (6/05)

The sale boundary and payment unit boundaries are marked and identified by blue, red and yellow paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against private property are marked with blue paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against state are marked with red paint. Interior Payment Unit boundaries are marked with yellow paint. Yellow painted trees designating an interior Payment Unit boundary are only to be cut when all surrounding Payment Units have been paid.

EXCEPTION: Unit boundary line between Units 3 and 4 is painted in red. Do not cut red painted trees.

EXCEPTION: DO NOT CUT any red pine trees marked with yellow paint.

EXCEPTION: DO NOT CUT any cedar, hemlock, or trees marked with green paint.

2 - Timber Specifications

2.1 - Included Timber

2.1.1 - Clearcut unit(s) with unmerchantable trees (2/04)

Within Payment Unit(s) 2, 3, 4, and 5, cut all trees that are two (2) inches or more in diameter measured at a point of four and one-half (4-1/2) feet above ground level regardless of merchantability.

EXCEPTION: Within Payment Unit 4 only cut oak species that are four (4) inches or more in diameter measured at a point of four and one-half (4-1/2) feet above ground level regardless of merchantability.

2.1.3 - Cut tree marked unit(s) (8/04)

Within Payment Unit(s) I all trees are designated for cutting when marked with orange paint above and below stump height, regardless of merchantability.

IN ADDITION: Cut all aspen and jack pine trees that are two (2) inches or more in diameter measured at a point four and one-half (4-1/2) feet above ground level regardless of merchantability.

2.1.8 - Designated plantation row unit(s) (3/07)

Within Payment Unit(s) 6, all red pine trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization, within designated plantation rows are designated for cutting. Plantation rows designated for cutting are identified by orange paint.

IN ADDITION: Cut all other tree species that are two (2) inches or more in diameter measured at a point 4-1/2 feet above ground level.

2.2 - Utilization

2.2.4 - Skidding length (2/04)

Skidding of unlimbed tops or lengths over 17 feet within Unit 6 is not permissible unless approved by the Unit Manager or their representative.

3 - Payments

3.4 - Damaged Timber

3.4.1 - Damaged timber (6/05)

General Condition and Requirement 3.4 Damaged Timber, defines liquidated damages for undesignated live merchantable trees which are cut or injured. Damage to residual trees (defined as breaking of the cambium layer, broken tops or bending of trees from their natural position) is not acceptable.

Within Units 1 & 4, if more than 25% of the tree seedlings or saplings (1/4" to 4.5" DBH) within a specified portion of the sale area are damaged, liquidated damages will be assessed at \$300 per acre for all acreage within that specified portion of the sale area that was damaged.

No damage is acceptable to merchantable trees.

Within Unis 1 & 6, if more than 5% of trees (> 4.5" DBH) within a specified area of the sale are damaged, liquidated damages will be assessed for all trees damaged. Rates will be in accordance with General Condition and Requirement 3.4 Damaged Timber, or at a rate of \$25 per sawtimber tree and \$5 per pole sized tree, whichever is greater.

4 - Transportation

4.1 - Construction

4.1.3 - Slash and earthen piles (8/04)

Piles or windrows of earth along roads and landings that have been widened or constructed shall be leveled. Slash from road maintenance or construction, including stumps, shall be utilized or dispersed throughout the sale.

4.4 - Access

4.4.3 - Access gate (10/06)

The access gate must be locked at all times. This is to prevent someone other than the purchaser from going through the gate and being locked in.

5 - Operations

5.2 - Conduct of Operations

5.2.1 - Slash

5.2.1.1 - Slash within sale area (2/04)

No trees are to be felled outside the sale area and all slash is to be kept at least 25 feet back from the blue paint line.

5.2.1.11 - Slash for reforestation (5/07)

To facilitate reforestation, Payment Unit(s) 2 & 3 shall be left with slash evenly distributed. Bunched tops within the cutting area shall be broken up and scattered. Stumps shall be cut low to the ground. Processing

sites shall not be left with a compacted layer of slash; tops from these sites shall be hauled back into the cut area and scattered.

5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions

5.2.3.1 - Operating restrictions (3/07)

Within Payment Unit(s) 4, unless changed by written agreement, cutting, skidding, and hauling are limited to September 01 through March31. This restriction is to help promote better aspen regeneration.

5.2.14 - Hunting operating restriction (2/04)

No payment unit may be started during the period of September 29 thru October 2nd or November 13 thru November 16th without permission of the Unit Manager or their representative.

5.2.15 - Bark beetle restriction (2/04)

In the event drought creates a high risk of pine bark beetle infestation, pine is not to be cut during the period March 1 through July 1, unless all portions of trees greater than two inches in diameter are removed from the sale area, reduced to chips, or treated to the satisfaction of the Unit Manager or their representative, within fifteen days of being severed from the stump. Pine logs, pulpwood piles and treetop piles for chipping that are decked in the fall or winter within a 1/4 mile of susceptible sites must be removed before March 15. Residual slash must not be placed in piles or rows and must be spread over the site for quick drying. The Department of Natural Resources will exercise this option if the risk of damage warrants.

5.2.31 - Landing locations (6/08)

Landing areas are marked on the timber sale map with the letter "L". Landings must be confined to these designated sites unless otherwise authorized by the Unit Manager or their representative.

5.4 - Soil Protection

5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (5/08)

Operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting of roads which is 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. In addition, operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting on skid trails which is 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. The Unit Manager or their representative may restrict hauling and/or skidding if ruts exceed the specified depth. With the Unit Manager or their representative's approval, the Purchaser may return to the area when the weather conditions have changed and/or the risk of rutting has decreased.

1 - Sale Area

1.2 - Boundaries

1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (6/05)

The sale boundary is marked and identified by blue and red paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against private property are marked with blue paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against state are marked with red paint. Do not cut painted boundary line trees unless also marked with orange paint.

2 - Timber Specifications

2.1 - Included Timber

2.1.1 - Clearcut unit(s) with unmerchantable trees (2/04)

Within Payment Unit(s) 2, 3, 4, & 5, cut all trees that are two (2) inches or more in diameter measured at a point of four and one-half (4-1/2) feet above ground level regardless of merchantability.

EXCEPTION: Within payment unit 2, remove all conifers and oak trees that are four (4) inches or more in diameter measured at a point 4 1/2 feet above ground level.

EXCEPTION: DO NOT CUT any cedar, hemlock or green painted trees.

2.1.2 - Clearcut unit(s) w/o unmerchantable trees (5/07)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1, cut all trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization.

EXCEPTION: DO NOT CUT any cedar, hemlock, white pine, or green painted trees.

EXCEPTION: Cut only red maple trees with a diameter of 8 inches or greater measured at a point 4 1/2 feet above ground level.

3 - Payments

3.4 - Damaged Timber

3.4.1 - Damaged timber (6/05)

General Condition and Requirement 3.4 Damaged Timber, defines liquidated damages for undesignated live merchantable trees which are cut or injured. Damage to residual trees (defined as breaking of the cambium layer, broken tops or bending of trees from their natural position) is not acceptable.

Within the sale area, if more than 25% of the tree seedlings or saplings (1/4" to 4.5" DBH) within a specified portion of the sale area are damaged, liquidated damages will be assessed at \$300 per acre for all acreage within that specified portion of the sale area that was damaged.

No damage is acceptable to merchantable trees. Within the sale area, if more than 5% of trees (> 4.5" DBH) within a specified area of the sale are damaged, liquidated damages will be assessed for all trees damaged. Rates will be in accordance with General Condition and Requirement 3.4 Damaged Timber or at a rate of \$25 per sawtimber tree and \$5 per pole sized tree, whichever is greater.

4 - Transportation

4.1 - Construction

4.1.1 - Stream crossings, general (2/04)

All stream crossing structures will be temporary and therefore, shall be provided by the purchaser, and must be removed upon completion of the sale. All permits for stream crossings will be provided by the DNR if required. The culvert is required to be metal, at least 18 inches in diameter, and 24 feet long.

4.1.8 - Road work (1) (8/07)

The following road work is required: for access to unit 5, an earthen bridge needs to be constructed over a gas transmission line easement identified on the sale map. Producer will add sand to the already existing bridge. The crossing must be five feet above ground level within the cleared gasline R.O.W.. In addition a geotextile fabric is to placed over the sand followed by a 6 inch crushed limestone cap. Sand may be used out of an existing borrow pit within the payment unit. The pit's sides need to be sloped at a gradual angle once sand is removed.

4.4 - Access

4.4.3 - Access gate (10/06)

The access gates to payment unit 5 must be locked at all times. This is to prevent someone other than the purchaser from going through the gate and being locked in.

5 - Operations

5.1 - Notification

5.1.3 - Well heads and natural gas pipelines (7/07)

The Purchaser is responsible for contacting the gas transission line companies prior to operating equipment in the vicinity of well heads or natural gas pipelines.

5.2 - Conduct of Operations

5.2.1 - Slash

5.2.1.1 - Slash within sale area (2/04)

No trees are to be felled outside the sale area and all slash is to be kept at least 15 feet back from the blue paint line.

5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions

5.2.3.1 - Operating restrictions (3/07)

Within Payment Unit(s) 5, unless changed by written agreement, cutting, skidding, and hauling are limited to September 01 to March 31. This restriction is to promote better aspen regeneration and limit the impact on wet soils present within the unit.

5.2.3.2 - Operating restrictions (3/07)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1, unless changed by written agreement, cutting, skidding, and hauling are limited to the months of December through March. This restriction is for the Lame Duck Foot Access Area time restriction.

5.2.3.3 - Operating restrictions (3/07)

Within Payment Unit(s) 5, unless changed by written agreement, cutting, skidding, and hauling are not permitted on the cleared portion of the gasline R.O.W. except at the designated crossing. No landing operations allowed within 50 feet of R.O.W. This restriction is limit vibrations to the buried gaslines.

5.2.14 - Hunting operating restriction (2/04)

No payment unit may be started during the period of September 29 thru October 2nd or November 13 thru November 16th without permission of the Unit Manager or their representative.

5.4 - Soil Protection

5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (5/08)

Operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting of roads which is 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length.
