Identified Planning Goals:

Vegetative management in the Voelker Plains management area will provide a variety of forest products; maintain or enhance wildlife habitat; protect areas with unique characteristics; and provide for forest based recreational uses. Timber management objectives for the include improving the age-class distribution of jack pine, aspen and lowland spruce/fir; maintaining the presence of minor cover types on the landscape; and maintaining non-forest vegetation types. Wildlife management objectives include addressing the habitat requirements identified for the following featured species: American woodcock, beaver, black bear and Kirtland's warbler. Management activities may be constrained by site conditions and the skewed age-class distributions.

Soil and topography:

Landform in the east portion of the compartment consists of primarily excessively drained sands in an outwash plain. Soils here are primary comprised of "Rubicon" and "Rubicon/Keweenaw Associate" Sands. The west portion of the compartment is comprised of level lowlands with Carbondale and Tawas muck soils.

Ownership Patterns, Development, and Land Use in and Around the Compartment:

This compartment is surrounded by state land and smaller private ownerships. Land use is primarily for forest production and passive recreation.

Unique Natural Features:

Sagola Lakes are present within the compartment. The western areas of this compartment are near an old opening complex once managed for sharp tail grouse.

Archeological, Historical, and Cultural Features:

There are no known sites in this compartment.

Special Management Designations or Considerations:

None other than riparian management areas.

Watershed and Fisheries Considerations:

This compartment contains the Sagola Lakes and Flat Rock Creek which both serve as tributaries to the West Branch of the Escanaba River. For Sagola Lakes, a 100' plus 5' per 1% increase in slope; buffer is recommended to protect inland lake shoreland areas in accordance with Best Management Practices. Flat Rock Creek is designated a Type 1 trout stream less than 50' width and has a predicted mean July temperature of 61.3 °F (cold stream). A 300' buffer is recommended for Flat Rock Creek in riparian areas susceptible to Aspen regeneration. For areas not susceptible to Aspen regeneration, 100' plus 5' per 1% increase in slope; buffers are recommended to protect these areas in accordance with Best Management Practices.

Wildlife Habitat Considerations:

Compartment 229 is found within the Voelker Plains Management Area; on an Outwash Plain in central Marquette County. The dominant Natural Communities are dry northern forests and dry mesic northern forests. Wildlife considerations in the Voelker Plains management area consist of: managing jack pine habitat with strategies that more closely mimic natural fire disturbance regimes and increasing stand size and striving to accommodate many species associated with xeric forest habitat is desirable. Wildlife management issues in the management area are: early successional forest conditions (associated with alder, riparian zones, or forested wetlands), mast (hard and soft); habitat fragmentation, early successional forest; and large open land complexes.

The following have been identified as featured species for the Voelker Plains Management Area: American woodcock, beaver, black bear, and Kirtland's warbler.

Mineral Resource and Development Concerns and/or Restrictions

Surface sediments consist of glacial outwash sand and gravel and postglacial alluvium, peat and muck and coarse-textured glacial till. The glacial drift thickness varies between 50 and 100 feet. The Precambrian Archean Granite/Gneiss subcrops below the glacial drift. There is not a current economic use for the Granite/Gneiss. Gravel pits are located north of the compartment (possibly old ones), and potential appears to be good along the west edge. The abandoned Republic iron mine is located seven miles to the northwest. The State land to the northwest of this compartment had been leased for metallic exploration. There is no economic oil and gas production in the UP.

Vehicle Access:

Good throughout the eastern part of this compartment and is limited due to poor drainage in the western half.

Survey Needs:

Any survey needed for timber sales will be summited after review.

Recreational Facilities and Opportunities:

There are no recreation faculties in this compartment. there is little potential for recreation development. This area will continue to be used for dispersed recreation.

Fire Protection:

The east portion of this compartment is in the 581 zone, fire response here is set by DNR fire plan. This area is accessible and good for mechanized fire suppression. The west portion of the compartment is mostly lowland spruce which would present challenges to fire suppression.


