Identified Planning Goals:

This compartment contains a portion of the most important deeryard complex in the central U.P. Maintaining thermal cover for deer is a priority. A significant proportion of the compartment will be managed as deer yard. Additional goals are to provide age-class distribution of Aspen by harvesting selected stands.

Soil and topography:

Geologic features are primarily drumlins with bogs and depressions on lake plains, moraines, and glacial drainageways. Topography is undulating with poorly drained mucks and peats interspersed among well drained loams. Other soils include well drained loams over limestone bedrock. Major soil series include Lupton, Tawas, Carbondale, Tacoosh, and Onaway.

Ownership Patterns, Development, and Land Use in and Around the Compartment:

This compartment is located in the vicinity of Watson, MI and what is locally known as "Finn Settlement". Most of the compartment is bordered by corporate land except in the north part of the comp. where the adjacent lands are mostly private residences and "camps". Land use is primarily low key recreation and whitetail deer yard.

Unique Natural Features:

Eagle and wood turtle to the northeast, southwest, and south. Eagle to the ne.

Osprey to the se. Potential for wood turtle. Potential for calypso bulbosa, round leaved orchid, limestone oak fern and Cypripedium arietinum in cedar swamp. Purple clematis to the NE.

Archeological, Historical, and Cultural Features:

None identified with HAL.

Special Management Designations or Considerations:

Large wetland complexes, extensive deer yard, riparian corridors.

Watershed and Fisheries Considerations:

This compartment contains Hunters Brook which serves as a tributary to the Mainstem Escanaba River. 100' plus 5' per 1% increase in slope; buffers are recommended for Hunters Brook to protect riparian areas in accordance with Best Management Practices.

Wildlife Habitat Considerations:

Compartment 088 is found within the North Menominee Management Area, which is a Drumlinized Ground Moraine in north Menominee and south Marquette Counties. The State Forest covers about 20,300 acres and is in scattered blocks. The dominant natural communities are poor conifer swamps and mesic northern forests. Major forest cover types include cedar, aspen, and mixed lowland conifer. In general, this area has a mid-range site quality. This management area provides multiple benefits to the public including forest products, dispersed recreational activities, and habitat for fish and wildlife species. Over half of the area is lowland conifer cover type (cedar, spruce, tamarack) interspersed with uplands of aspen and northern hardwoods. Historically this management area has been important deer winter range. Some of the most significant wildlife management issues in the management area are: habitat fragmentation; course woody debris; large living and dead standing trees (for cavities); mesic conifer (in a broad array of age classes); mature forest; early successional forest (jack pine, mixed swamp conifer, tag alder, and aspen); and deer wintering habitat.

The following have been identified as featured species for the North Menominee Management Area: American marten, snowshoe hare, and white-tailed deer.

Mineral Resource and Development Concerns and/or Restrictions

Compartment 88 Sections 5-6, 16, 21, & 24, T42N-R25W, Marquette County

No known potential exists for commercial oil & gas production in this part of the state. The nearest active sand/gravel pits are one mile west and east. Bedrock carbonate and/or sandstone is at or near the surface throughout the area. Potential for aggregate resources within the compartment may be limited to the upland drumlins in Sec 5. There is no known

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potential for metallic minerals beneath the compartment, and no known ground-based mineral exploration has occurred within the compartment. There has been no recent State mineral leasing activity in the area. The State does not own all the mineral rights within the compartment. Because the mineral estate is the dominant estate, the surface owner must provide the owner of the mineral rights reasonable access to the surface for mineral exploration and development.

Vehicle Access:

This compartment has good access from Co. Rd 426, Mashek Grade, Finn Settlement Road, and numerous two-tracks. Some private access needed to areas.

Survey Needs:

Possible survey needs in Section 5.

Recreational Facilities and Opportunities:

This is an excellent area is for ruffed grouse and whitetail deer hunting, and as a result, sees lots of activity.

Fire Protection:

Low to moderate wildland fire potential. A lot of wet ground and poor access areas.


