Identified Planning Goals:

To maintain the health and sustainability of the forest, while providing for wildlife, fisheries, environmental and recreational needs.

Soil and topography:

Uplands of Rubicon sand, Sayner-Rubicon, Croswell sand with lowland conifer swamps containing Carbondale and Tawas, and Tawas-Deford mucks. Some well-drained Garlic-Alcona-Voelker complex found within hardwood uplands along the Perrin Bros. Road.

Ownership Patterns, Development, and Land Use in and Around the Compartment:

Isolated 40 ac and 1 ac private holding(s) within central portion of compartment, otherwise State ownership. Numerous camps and private landholdings adjacent, making this a fairly high-use hunting and recreation area.

Unique Natural Features:

See MNFI comments. Potential for calypso orchid and ram's head lady's-slipper. Potential for eagle, osprey, frigga fritillary, red-shouldered hawk, goshawk and wood turtle. Potential for gray wolf.

Archeological, Historical, and Cultural Features:

Special Management Designations or Considerations:

Chain Lakes Moraine Management Area. Rich conifer swamp within Section 12 (See MNFI comments/abstracts)

Watershed and Fisheries Considerations:

NLMMU – John Bauman: This compartment contains Miller Creek, Chandler Brook, and Anderson Lake. Miller Creek and Chandler Brook are designated Type 1 trout stress less than 50 foot wide and have predicted mean July water temperatures that range from 63.3 to 65.1 °F (cold streams). A minimum 300-foot buffer is recommended for Miller Creek and Chandler Brook in riparian areas susceptible to Aspen regeneration. For areas not susceptible to Aspen regeneration, a minimum 100-foot, plus 5 feet per 1% increase in slope, buffer is recommended to protect these areas in accordance with Best Management Practices. The eastern region of this compartment borders Anderson Lake. A minimum 100-foot buffer is recommended for Anderson Lake to protect shoreland resources in accordance with Best Management Practices and the Michigan Wildlife Action Plan.

Wildlife Habitat Considerations:

This compartment is found within the Soumi Till and Outwash Management Area, on a Disintegration Moraine in Southwestern Marquette County. The dominant Natural Communities are dry mesic northern forests, poor conifer swamps, and mesic northern forests. This management area offers opportunities to increase diversity and perhaps long-term oak sustainability through under planting white and red pine. Another priority is to maintain or increase wildlife corridors especially along riparian corridors. Wildlife management issues in the management area are mast (hard and soft); habitat fragmentation; mature forest conditions; mesic conifer; course woody debris; and retention or development of large living and dead standing trees (for cavities). This management area represents approximately ¼ of the oak resource on WUP state forest.

The following have been identified as featured species for the Soumi Till and Outwash Management Area: Blackburnian Warbler, Golden-winged Warbler, Kirtland's Warbler, Red Crossbill, Black-backed Woodpecker, Ruffed Grouse, American Marten, White-tailed Deer, Black Bear.

Mineral Resource and Development Concerns and/or Restrictions

Surface sediments consist of medium-textured glacial till, and minor amounts of peat and muck and glacial outwash sand and gravel and postglacial alluvium. The glacial drift thickness varies between 100 and 200 feet. The Cambrian Trempealeau Formation and Munising Group subcrop below the glacial drift. The Trempealeau could be used for stone.

Gravel pits are located two miles to the northeast, and there should be some potential on the uplands. Abandoned iron mines are located four miles to the northeast. This compartment has not been leased, but leases for metallic exploration were located in the Township to the south. There is no economic oil and gas production in the UP.

Vehicle Access:

The Perrin Bros. Road, a county maintained good gravel seasonal road bisects the compartment, with only a few closed two-track roads providing additional access. The Miller Creek Road, a State maintained Road, provides access to the NW portion of the compartment. This road receives heavy year-round traffic, and is in need of maintenance. Access on the east is via the Anderson Lake SFCG Road.

Survey Needs:

Survey needed in Section 10 and 11 for adjacent timber sale treatments.

Recreational Facilities and Opportunities:

Anderson Lake and Flacks Lakes trails, Anderson Lake State Forest Campground and boat access site. A State-sponsored snowmobile trail (Trail #33) utilizes both the Perrin Bros.and Miller Creek Roads during the winter months. Heavy hunting use.

Fire Protection:

Fire response time will be around 1/2 hour, with control efforts requiring around the same amount of time if located on upland grounds. Lowland ground fires would require additional control time and alternate suppression tactics.






