



MEMORANDOM.

This plat is based upon a re-establishment of the lines defining the lands in a portion of T. 35 N., S. 4 W., Michigan Meriddan, Michigan, as shown upon the official plat approved Potrury 9, 1854, and an extension survey including lands not shown upon and plat. The original lines have been identified and the corner remembered with iron potr having breast plat of the property of the property of the property of the property of the plat of the property of the plat of the p caps suitably marked.

The heavy irregular lines delineate the position of the meander lines of Grooked Lake and of Pickerel Lake, as arronously surveyed in 1840. Experian rights do not stack to the lands in front of these lines under the usual doctrine. These lines have been re-established as fixed boundaries, with adjusted courses and distances based upon the record of the original survey.

All subdivisions shown on the original plat remain undisturbed for position, but where sees are immeded by Crocked Lake and by Pictoral Lake, at their areas are obsern in two parts: "As denoting land area, and "A" mater saws. These "a" and "b" areas are computed proportionally, according to the total areas of the original subdivisions.
