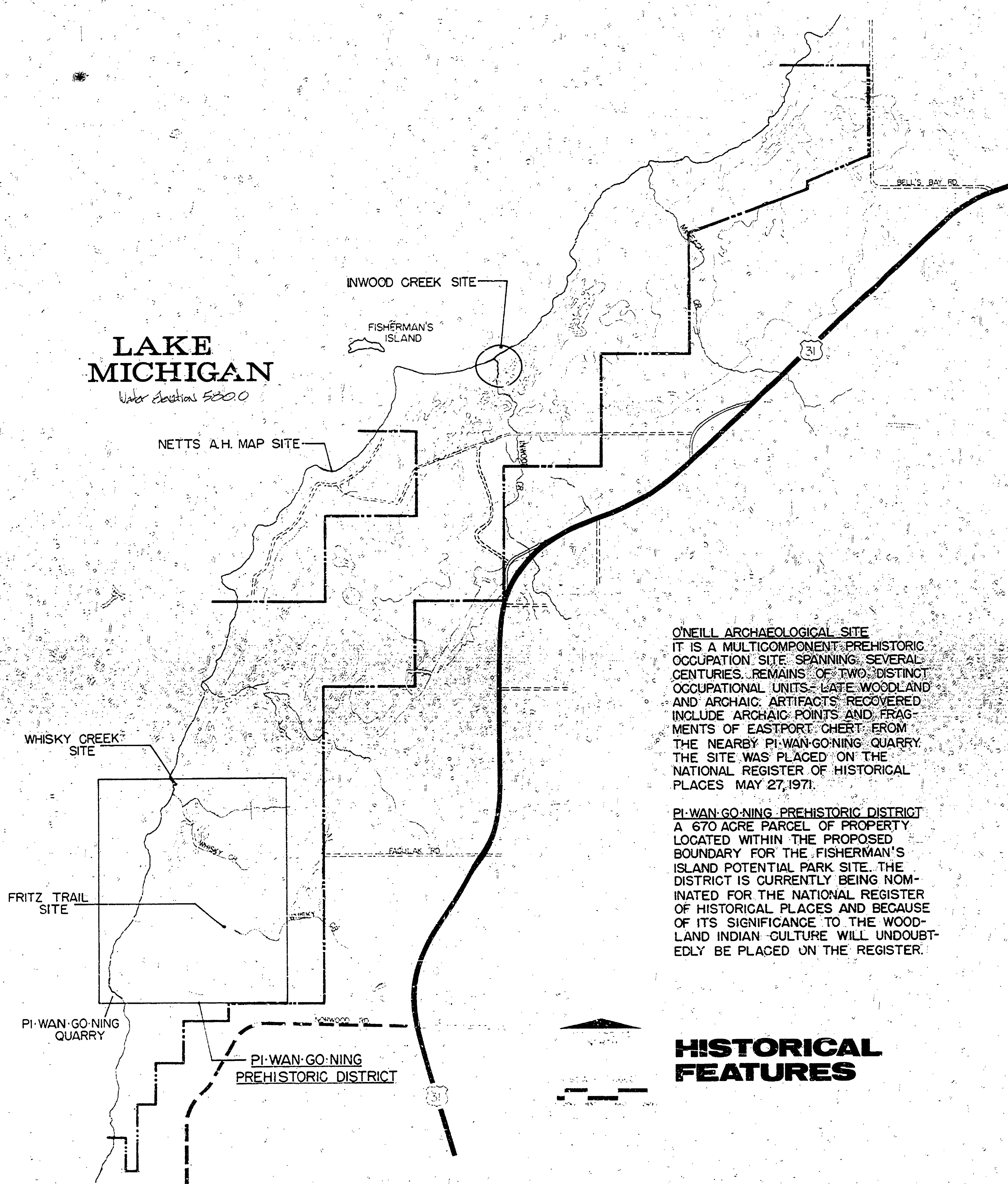


LAKE MICHIGAN

O'NEILL ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE
IT IS A MULTICOMPONENT PREHISTORIC OCCUPATION SITE SPANNING SEVERAL CENTURIES. REMAINS OF TWO DISTINCT OCCUPATIONAL UNITS - LATE WOODLAND AND ARCHAIC ARTIFACTS RECOVERED INCLUDE ARCHAIC POINTS AND FRAGMENTS OF EASTPORT CHERT FROM THE NEARBY PI-WAN-GO-NING QUARRY. THE SITE WAS PLACED ON THE NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORICAL PLACES MAY 27, 1971.

PI-WAN-GO-NING PREHISTORIC DISTRICT
A 670 ACRE PARCEL OF PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN THE PROPOSED BOUNDARY FOR THE FISHERMAN'S ISLAND POTENTIAL PARK SITE. THE DISTRICT IS CURRENTLY BEING NOMINATED FOR THE NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORICAL PLACES AND BECAUSE OF ITS SIGNIFICANCE TO THE WOODLAND INDIAN CULTURE WILL UNDOUBTEDLY BE PLACED ON THE REGISTER.
