I, **BRIAN REYNOLDS**, in a field survey on **OCTOBER 24**, 19 **95**,

do hereby certify that under requirements of P.A. 74, Michigan P.A. of 1970, the corner points mentioned in lines 1 and 2 above were in conformance with regulations and rules therefore as required in the current manual of survey instructions of the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management or by a decree of a Court of Law and/or that the corner points mentioned in lines 3, 4 and 5 above were in conformance with the rules of the Michigan Board of Land Surveyors or by a Decree of a Court of Law; established, re-established, monumented, re-monumented, recovered, found as expressed below:

NOTE: Not more than 4 corners, all in the same town and range, may be recorded on this certificate.

A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

1. MEANDER CORNER ON WEST SIDE OF LITTLE LONG LAKE WAS ESTABLISHED BY GENERAL LAND OFFICE DEPUTY SURVEYOR JOHN MULLETT IN DECEMBER, 1825. THE NOTES INDICATE THAT THE CORNER WAS 37.16 CHAINS EAST OF J-13, THE NEAREST STANDARD CORNER NOT IN A LAKE. MEANDER POST NOTED AS "LEAVE LAKE SET POST ASPEN 10 S24E 29 ELM 8 S22 1/2W 40."
2. RESURVEY OF PRAIRIEVILLE TOWNSHIP BY BARRY COUNTY DEPUTY SURVEYOR JOHN Q. CRESSY IN OCTOBER, 1884, NOTES INDICATE THAT FROM J-13 TO THE WEST BANK OF LITTLE LONG LAKE IS 30.12 CHAINS. CRESSY'S NOTES INDICATE THAT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 36 IS "IN LAKE." CRESSY DID NOT SET A POST ON THE SHORE, AND NO WITNESS WERE NOTED.

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

NO DIRECT EVIDENCE REMAINS OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE SURVEY OR THE CRESSY RESURVEY BETWEEN J-13 AND LITTLE LONG LAKE. THERE ARE SEVERAL HUNDRED FEET OF MARSH BETWEEN THE OPEN WATERS OF LITTLE LONG LAKE AND THE HIGH GROUND TO THE WEST; THIS WOULD ACCOUNT FOR THE DIFFERENCE IN DISTANCE CITED BY CRESSY AND MULLETT. AFTER RESTORING THE BASE LINE BETWEEN LITTLE LONG LAKE AND GULL LAKE, AND TRAVERSING TO J-13 T1N R10W AND J-1 T1S R10W, DETERMINED THAT BEST METHOD OF RESTORATION OF MEANDER CORNER WOULD BE TO PLACE IT ON LINE BETWEEN RESTORED POINT ON BASE LINE ON EAST SIDE OF LONG LAKE AND J-13, AS CLOSE AS IS PRACTICAL TO THE OPEN WATERS OF LITTLE LONG LAKE. SET HARRISON MONUMENT ON SMALL HIGH SPOT NEAR OPEN WATER. TWO PARALLEL EAST-WEST FENCES INTERSECT THE LAKE; THE OLDER FENCE IS 8' NORTH OF THE MONUMENT, THE NEWER FENCE IS 14.5' NORTH OF THE MONUMENT.
