

A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

(A-5 / A-6) Meander Corner Common to Section 18, T. 45 N., R. 11 W., and Section 13, T. 45 N., R. 12 W.

1841 John Burt set post in original survey of the township line on the North shore of Manistique Lake, 19.18 chains South of the section corner. Witnesses: 14" W. Birch N 45° W 4 lks.

1986 J.H. Granger P.S. 16041 in a survey recorded in pages 102-104, Luce County Survey Records, shows an iron found on the section line 1372.76' South of the section corner.

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

(A-5 / A-6) Meander Corner Common to Section 18, T. 45 N., R. 11 W., and Section 13, T. This corner is being perpetuated as part of the Luce County Remonumentation Program.
