Found "t" iron set by G. Fauser, no witnesses remain. Also we found "A-3" the corner for Tyrone Township, North 156.27 feet (record), 156.23 feet (measured). The re-rod shown on page 21 of the dossier as 8.73 feet South of the "t" iron was also found. The corner is on the slope of a hill and not in the roadway.

1823 Hervey Parke, U.S. Deputy Surveyor - North on the East boundary of Section 12 of Deerfield Township set corner mile post common to Sections 1 & 12.

1874 W. Bullock, County Surveyor - indicates the distance between A-3 and M-3 as 2.37 chains (156.42) and repeats the GLO witnesses.

1971 G. Fauser a surveyor for the Consumers Power Co. - Surveys the Majestic-Blackfoot Corridor (pages 15-17), and sets a "t" iron rod and witnesses the same.

1973 E. Anderson, surveys in Sections 11 and 12 of Deerfield Township, and in Sections 6 and 7 of Tyrone Township (pages 18 and 19) and ties to the Northeast corner of Section 12, and cites a found "t" iron, and witnesses the same.

1977 Dave Finney, surveys the same parcels as Anderson and verifies the "t" iron.

DONALD W. ROSS
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I recommend replacing the found "t" iron with a remonumentation pipe and disk. The area is shaded overhead with woods to the South and is not suitable for GPS positioning.
