

5. Private Claims

I. Joseph C. A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

1956 - Ned Hawley, Timber cruiser, noted in his copy of the original notes and in a note on loose paper in the field book that he found a cedar stake at the corner. He noted that the cedar stake fell at the top of hill to river. north of slight draw. He made a note to verify that both B.T.'s were maple but does not indicate if he did find , original B.T.s.

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I found no remains of the original corner. I found the rotten remains of the cedar post (stake) called for by Hawley. A shallow depression with remains of unidentified rotten wood corresponds with where the 14" Maple B.T. would fall. The post falls at the west top of ravine, 8' +/- north of a shallow feeder ravine as called for by Hawley. Distances to section corners East, West and North work well with GLO. I have accepted the position of the cedar post as the township comer.
