(E-1/2) Meander Corner common to Sections 4 and 5, T51N, R40W

A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

- 1845 - William A. Burt intersected Lake Superior 28.65 chains (1890.90') north of E 1/4 corner and set fir post, 14" W. Pine S 75° E 29 links
- Supervisor's Plat of Gov't Lots 1 & 2, Section 5, T51N, R40W shows a monument on the section line 1825.05' north of the E 1/4 Corner Section 5.
1941 - Supervisor's Floodwood Plat of NW 1/4 of Section 4, T51N, R40W, shows a concrete monument on the section line 1784.90' North of the E 1/4 corner of Section 5, and a concrete monument at the 1/16 corner 1320' north of the E 1/4 corner of Section 5.
1969 - M.S.H.D. for M-64 Highway plans show concrete monuments at the E 1/4 corner and the 1/16 corner. They do not indicate anything at the Meander Corner.

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

Original Meander Corner and accessories have been destroyed by shoreline erosion. I found a 3/4" iron pin at the shoreline. I recovered the 1/16 corner and E 1/4 corner as called for in Floodwood Plat and Highway plans. Additional work in Floodwood Plat confirms that these monuments have not been moved from their original positions.

The 3/4" pin at the shore falls 20.48' west of the section line established by Floodwood Plat. I did not accept the pin, and held the plat monuments for the section line. I established a witness corner to the Meander corner on this section line 171.55' south of original GLO Meander corner. Original Meander corner falls in Lake Superior.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

Corner is a 3/4" x 72" aluminum rod with a 3" diameter aluminum cap stamped to read: W.C.M.C; S.4, S.5; T.51N., R.40W.; 1996; P.S. 37273 COUNTY REMONUMENTATION. Corner falls 54' south of shore of Lake Superior.
