Bryan Boss in a field survey on phereby certily that under requirements of P.A. 74, Michigan P.A. of 1970, the corner points mentioned lines 1 and 2 above were in conformance with regulations and rules therefore as required in the irrent manual of survey instructions of the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land anagement or by a decree of a Court of Law and/or that the corner points mentioned in lines 3, 4 and 5 pove were in conformance with the rules of the Michigan Board of Land Surveyors or by a Decree of a ourt of Law; established, re-established, monumented, re-monumented, recovered, found as epressed below:

West 1/4 Corner, Section 34, T2N-R6E, Brighton Township, Livingston County, Michigan.

Found 3/4" Iron Pipe 11 feet \pm North of centerline of Culver Road at North edge of pavement. GPS is good at this location. Two point used at this location.

In June of 1959, Clay Gordon recorded distance S2°32'58"E, 587.69 feet from West 1/4 Corner of Section 34 to centerline U.S. 16 Highway. Later on July 8, 1959, Clay Gordon witnesses found 1/2" iron at West 1/4 Corner.

In approximately 1960, M.D.O.T. witnessed this same point (see page 7) and the M.D.O.T. survey (see page 12A) appears to be the same point that Clay Gordon used. The Giffels-Webster survey and witness (pages 14, 15, 16) and the Boss Engineering survey (pages 18, 19, 20) use the same points as the Gordon and M.D.O.T. surveys.

On February 29, 1960, John C. Miller platted Greenfield Shores No. 3 and designated point of beginning as 33 feet North of East 1/4 post of Section 33.

Giffels-Webster Engineers survey in 1976 (see pages 14, 15, 16) finds 3/4" pipe 8.22 feet North of East 1/4 Corner per plat. Recorded distance sheet (page 6 this dossier) reveals Clay Gordon, M.D.O.T, Giffels-Webster and Boss Engineering are in agreement with measurement from 1/4 corner to centerline of I-96 X-Way. It is also evident that David Finney (see page 17) utilized John Miller's plat monument to establish West 1/4 Corner 8.22 feet South of 1959 Clay Gordon Survey. Finney's survey was subsequent to Giffels-Webster survey; however, he apparently decided to use the plat for the East-West 1/4 line.

Conclusion: We recommend acceptance of 3/4" pipe as same location utilized by Clay Gordon in 1959, M.D.O.T. in 1960±, Giffel-Webster in 1976 and Boss Engineering in 1982 as the true West 1/4 Corner of Section 34.
