

COHOCTAH M-13

The notes for the subdivision of this township do not indicate who first set this corner. John Mullett recovers this point in running the east townline on April 11th, 1823. The south townline was run from this point the following day. Additionally, County Surveyor M.W. Bullock recovers the point in 1875.

Early in the year 1964, L. W. Munsell recovers a 1/2" iron for the corner. Apparently this point was removed because in the fall of 1972 Karol R. Piotrowski sets a railroad spike for the corner utilizing Munsell'66 records. This work is recorded on LSC 729. The late Pat Benton's records, though undated, identify the point as a railroad spike, referring also to Boss Job No. 9649.

In 1984, A.F. Miller recovers a railroad spike for the corner. However, surveys by Garlock '76 and '77, Stonerock '73, and Boss'87 identify the point as a 1/2" iron.

In October 1993, the fieldcrews recovered a 1/2" iron rod at this location and located three witnesses that can be traced back to Munsell'64. The postion of this corner relative to quarter corner L-13 and closing corner A-12 a half-mile north of this point is in substantial agreement with the lengths of those lines as noted on surveys by Garlock '90, Gordon '38, and Miller '73 and '84.
