### A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

I-5 Common Section Corner, Sections 10, 11, 14, & 15, T4N-R4E, Cohoctah Township, Livingston County

Wood post placed during the original government survey by Sylvester Sibley, Deputy Surveyor in 1823. Two witnesses were marked at this time and no evidence of the original government accessories were located.

### B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I-5 Common Section Corner, Sections 10, 11, 14, & 15, T4N-R4E, Cohoctah Township, Livingston County

Found no evidence of original government corner. Found "T" iron 8' ± west of a North-South fence and 6' ± North of occupied line running East-West. Verified the position of the found "T" iron with witnesses and measurements (see back) from 1973 to present. Found no conflicting evidence in the vicinity of this position. We recommend that the found "T" iron be accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original government corner and be replaced with a standard Livingston County monument with brass cap and carsonite post.

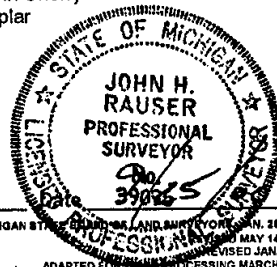
### C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

I-5 Common Section Corner, Sections 10, 11, 14, & 15, T4N-R4E, Cohoctah Township, Livingston County

Set standard Livingston County monument with brass cap stamped "I-5 39096".

West 7.82' Set nail with Livingston County Survey Witness Tag in North face of 5 stem Oak (stem = 24")  
N10W 25.42' Set nail with Livingston County Survey Witness Tag in West face of 12" Cherry  
S45E 30.05' Set nail with Livingston County Survey Witness Tag in Southwest face of 10" Twin Cherry  
S40W 42.67' Set nail with Livingston County Survey Witness Tag in Northwest face of 10" Poplar  
North 0.50' Set Carsonite Marker Post
