I, Anthony M. Slawinski, in a field survey on July 30, 19 97 do hereby state that under requirements of P.A. 74, Michigan P.A. of 1970, the corner points mentioned in lines 1 and 2 above were in conformance with regulations and rules therefore as required in the current manual of survey instructions of the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management or by a decree of a Court of Law and /or that the corner points mentioned in lines 3, 4 and 5 above were in conformance with the rules of the Michigan Board of Land Surveyors or by a Decree of a Court of Law; established, re-established, monumented, recovered, found as expressed below:

NOTE: Not more than 2 corners, all in the same town and range, may be recorded on this certificate.

A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

M-05 Meander Corner South of the South east Section Corner of Section 12, T21N., R17W.

Set by John Brink in 1838

73.70 Chains Int. West Margin of Manistee Lake - Set Post

1. Beech 11" S 51 1/2° E 17 links (Gone)

2. W. Ash 8" S 38 1/2° W 11 links (Gone)

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

M-05 Meander Corner South of the South east Section Corner of Section 12, T21N., R17W.

Calculated the East 1/4 Corner of Section 13 by intersecting the North-South Range line and the Indian reservation line, which is common to the Oak Hill Plat and the First Rietz Park Addition Plat, and used government measure from the computed location of the East 1/4 Post to establish the location of the Meander corner. This was done on the advice of Bob Griffin on July 18, 1997. We were unable to set the Meander Corner in its computed location, so a Witness Corner was set 425.80 feet to the North of the computed position on line.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

M-05 Meander Corner South of the South east Section Corner of Section 12, T21N., R17W.

On July 30, 1997, I installed a Manistee County Monument, flush to the ground, by measuring government measure from the calculated East 1/4 corner of Section 13, T21N., R17W., North to the calculated position of the meander corner. The calculated position put the corner inside a building at the Ambar chemical plant. Then, because I was unable to set the corner in this location, I continued North on line 425.80 feet and set a witness corner as a careful and faithful witness to the position of the original corner, and witnessed by: The area were original corner was placed has been filled.

3. N 33° W 244.55' Fence Corner
4. S 44° W 184.83' Fence Corner
5. S 30° W 314.18' Building Corner
6. S 03° E 130.68' 4" Monitor Well

Note: the corner lies ±20' South of Manistee Lake
