

A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

(H-9) 1/4 Corner Common to Sections 22 and 27, T51N, R38W

1846- H. and S.W. Higgins set a 1/4 post.

I found no recored of subsequent restoration but Milton Eva RLS 1767 and William A. Waara (Copper Range Forester) were doing retracement work in this area in the 1930's to 1950's.

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I found no remains of the original corner or accessories. I found a 2 ½ " bent iron pipe at the corner position. The position of this pipe works well with 1/16 corner pipe and fence corner to the east. Distance East to the Section corner is very short but this is not inconsistent with the type of work done by the original surveyors in this and other townships. I have accepted the position of the iron pipe as the best representation of the position of the original ¼ corner and have placed a county monument at it.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

Corner is a 2 ½" x 30" aluminum pipe with a 3" diameter aluminum cap stamped to read: COUNTY REMONUMENTATION; T51N, R38W; ½; S. 22, S.27; 2000; P.S. 37273. Corner falls 22' North of an East-West electric fence.
