

I found no record of Subsequent Restoration.

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I found no remains of original corner or accessories. Sylvester Hoffman, a longtime resident of the area told me that he remembered there being an "iron stake" at this corner. I recovered a 2" diameter mushroomed pipe at the corner. A very old fence runs North and South from the pipe. The pipe works well with other corners in the area as well as with occupation. I accepted the iron pipe as the true section corner.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

Corner is a ¾" x 48" aluminum rod, driven inside a 2" iron pipe, with a 3" diameter aluminum cap stamped to read: COUNTY REMONUMENTATION; T52N, R39W, R38W; S. 12, S. 13, S. 7, S. 18; 2000; P.S. 37273. Ties
