B. Description of comer evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I recovered the monument set by Sperhake and four of his bearing trees. It works well with the original Maple B.T which is still alive and is now 22"+ in diameter. The monument also works well with the remains of the 26" Black ash, which is now fallen and decayed. I accepted Sperhake's monument as the correct position for the Section Corner.
