

I found no record of subsequent restoration.

B. Description of comer evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I found no remains of the original corner or accessories. I found East - West paved Firesteel Road and an old Fallen fence running North and South from the comer position. I created a position for the section comer at the intersection of centerline and extension of the fences. This position works well with distances to corners to North and West as well as with occupation. I have determined that this position best represents the true section corner.

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner

Corner is a 5/8" x 12" iron pin with a 3" diameter aluminum cap stamped to read: COUNTY REMONUMENTATION; T52N, R39W, R38W; S. 25, S. 36, S. 30, S. 31; 2000; P.S. 37273. I also established a Reference Monument (R.M.) to the North, a 2 ½" x 30" aluminum pipe with a 3" diameter cap stamped to indicate that the section corner is \$ 01°30'E, 28.11'. Ties to the corner.
