LAND CORNER RECORDATION CERTIFICATE

above were in conformance with the rules of the Michigan Board of Land Surveyors of by a Decree of a Count of Law, established, me-established, monumented, re-covered found as expressed below. NOTE: Not more than 4 corners, all in the same town and range, may be recorded on this cartificate. A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration: The original corner was set by deputy surveyor Sylvcester Sibley on July 7, 1836. Set wood post 39, 94 chains from the East. Hemlock 10" N75% 11 lks. From 1891 to 1904 approximately. Osceola County had a remonumentation program, in which surveyors Temple and Trumbull, did the work. For the most part, a 3" glazed tile filled with cinders from a forge, were placed at each government set corner in the township. There were supposed to be 3 tile per corner, placed atop of each other, (continued on back) B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner. Bound 1" bar 8" below surface and excavated to 36" and removed bar, which is 54" long. Pressed magnetic locater in hole left by bar, estimated 55" below surface and found no indication of corner. Placed Osceola County monument over position of bar. C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner. Corner D-11. Osceola County Monument, which is a 3" brass cap mounted on a 1" pipe 18" in length. Telephone Pole S508 38.10 feet 0.B.P. NE Corner of House S50W 93.10 feet. 0.B.P. Power Pole N36W 69.2 feet. thereby making the corner 4 feet long. Sometimes a solid tile, with a cross in the top was used, and sometimes a 1/2" iron bars were added to the tile. Notes of the work were kept in ledgers, and given to the townships, and 5 of the townships have been recorded in the County records.

This corner is recorded in the Rose Lake Twp. Book, pages 28 & 29.
