

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I found no remains of the original corner or accessories. I found the iron pin called for by MSHD. It falls on the extension of a fence to the South. It falls 820.5' East of centerline of U.S. 45. I found two remaining MSHD Bearing Trees, the Elm to the NW (now dead and fallen) and the Maple N13°E. Distances from these to the 1" iron pin work well. Distances to corners east and west work reasonably well. I accepted the 1" iron pin as the 1/4 corner and replaced it with a county monument.

C. Description of monument for comer and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:
