Domitrovich, in a field survey on November 4, 1999, do hereby state that under requirements of P.A. 74, Michigan P.A. of 1970, the corner points mentioned in lines 1 and 2 above were in conformance with regulations and rules therefore as required in the current manual of survey instructions of the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management or by a decree of a Court of Law and/or that the corner points mentioned in lines 3, 4 and 5 above were in conformance with the rules of the Michigan Board of Land Surveyors or by a Decree of a Court of Law; established, re-established, monumented, recovered, found as expressed below:

NOTE: Not more than 2 corners, all in the same town and range, may be recorded on this certificate.

A. Description of original monument and accessories and/or subsequent restoration:

(K-6) 1/4 Corner Common to Sections 14 & 13, T51N, R40W.

1845 William A. Burt set a Hemlock Post with ties:

10" Fir	N 20°E	35 links
10" Sugar	N 16°W	17 links

No Subsequent Restoration Found.

B. Description of corner evidence found and/or method applied in restoring or reestablishing corner:

I found no remains of the original corner or accessories. I found no evidence whatsoever of the 1/4 corner. Therefore I treated it as a lost corner and re-established it by Single Proportionate Measurement between Section corners to the North and South.

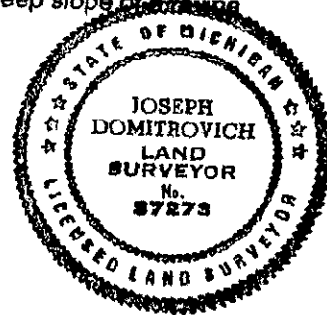

C. Description of monument for corner and accessories established to perpetuate locating the position of the corner:

Corner is a 2 1/2" x 30" aluminum pipe with a 3" diameter aluminum cap stamped to read: County Remonumentation; T51N, R40W; 1/4; S. 13, S. 14; 1999; P.S. 37273. Corner falls 1/3 of the way down the steep slope of section descending to the East. Ties:

6" Soft Maple	S 09°W	9.32'
4" Hard Maple	S 75°W	5.40'
6" Hard Maple	N 10°E	24.41'
Steel Sign Rail	East	0.80' (to Face)
NE Corner Section 14	N 00°24'22"W	2621.64'
SE Corner Section 14	S 00°24'22"E	2621.64'



NOTE: Bearings to witness objects are magnetic. Distances are to a nail in side of the witness object unless noted.
