## MAP INFORMATION

Project information is derived weekly from the MDNR's Land Ownership Database. Project Categories indicate the Agency responsible for management of the land.

DNR Dedicated Boundaries were digitized from Michigan Natural Resources Magazine, 1984. "Mapbook of Michigan Counties", TwoPeninsula Press.

Parcel information is compiled to the quarter-quarter section level. Multiple parcels within a quarter-quarter section can result in the Multiple Projects category.

## COMPLETENESS and QUALITY

In general, the data does not reflect platted parcels, Private Claims, and parcels within the City of Detroit and/or Saint Clair County Flats.

The amount of acreage owned within a quarter-quarter section is identified by acreage labels in the upper-right corner of each quarter-quarter section.

The quality and completeness of this data is unknown. It is suggested that this data be combined with a second source, such as plat maps, to further identify ownership.
